A Message from the Pastor:

Unworthiness...

This time of year, we begin the stories of Jesus' ministry, and it always makes me think about worthiness. Throughout the bible we hear those who encounter Jesus and feel unworthy. John the Baptist, who says I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandal, the centurion's interaction as he asks Jesus to heal his beloved servant. Or like in Luke 5:1-11 when Jesus calls the disciples and Simon says, "Go away from me Lord, for I am a sinful man!" I am sure it was hard to be confident amid Jesus' glory, in the upheaval of rules in which Jesus would create from his miracles. Yet, Jesus time and time again calls those who feel unworthy. Those who find their own gifts incomplete or not of great importance in society.

It is easy to feel unworthy when we are called into sharing Christ's message. How are we supposed to catch people? Those words in the calling of the disciples stop me every time and make me feel unworthy. How do I do that? How are my gifts used to convince others of God's love? What is amazing about God's love in Christ is that God chooses the most unexpected places and people to spread this love. Most of the time those are the ones who need the message the most, but also who can authentically share the amazement of Christ's work.

by Jesus' power and compassion and using it. Jesus affirmed the gifts of others and affirmed their identities in wonderful ways. Jesus takes our unworthy and transforms it into worthiness and blessedness.

So today is a great day to remind yourself and others of that. You are blessed and worthy even if you don't feel it. You are called and capable even if you forget, your gifts are important and used even when you don't realize it. Don't be afraid, be filled! I invite you today to reflect and pray.

Questions for Reflection:

1. How often do you feel unworthy with others or in certain situations?
2. What ways can you help others see their worthiness today?

them, transform them. Make our ordinary
lives reflections of your love as we walk
with one another in this journey of life.*

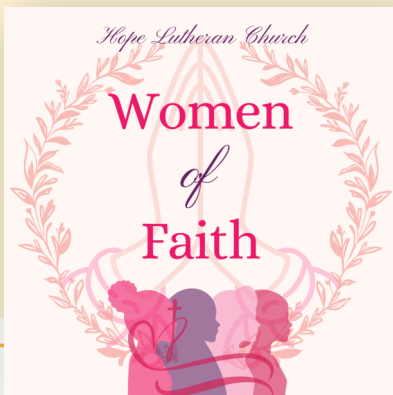

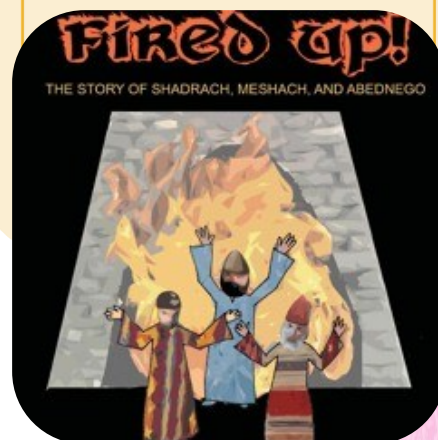

TAX-FREE IRA GIVING FOR SENIORS AGES 70½+

If you're looking for a way to reduce your taxable income from your Individual Retirement Account (IRA) while making a meaningful contribution to Hope Lutheran Church, then the IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) is an excellent option to consider! By making a tax-free contribution to our ministries through your IRA, you can satisfy your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) without increasing your Federal income taxes. The amount that you contribute directly to Hope Lutheran from your IRA is not taxable. This means that the IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution is a tax-reducing and tax-free way to contribute to our church. This is an excellent way for seniors to be able to reduce their Federal taxable income without the need to itemize their deductions.



If you're 70-1/2 years of age or older, you can instruct your IRA administrator to transfer your contribution directly from your IRA account to Hope Lutheran Church. We can put your contribution to use right away in providing financial support to our ministries throughout the Church. By choosing to make an IRA QCD contribution to Hope Lutheran, you'll not only be supporting our ministries but also reducing your taxable income, making it a win-win situation for everyone involved.

It is also important to note that the total IRA QCD contributions in this year cannot exceed \$111,000, and the QCD contribution must be made as part of your IRA Required Minimum Distribution for the year. 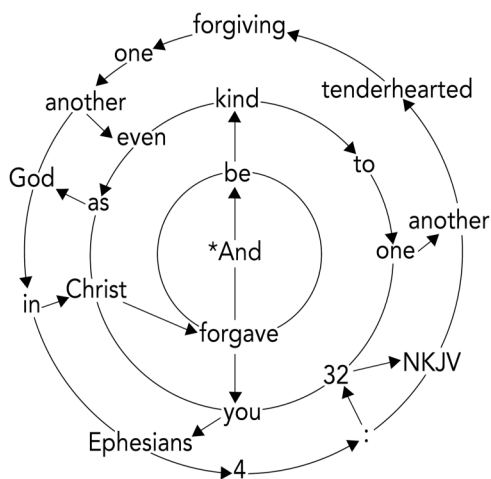

FOR CARPORT**

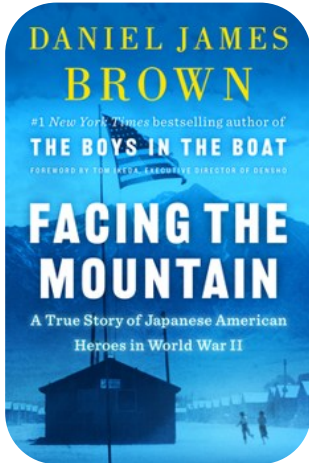

From the #1 New York Times bestselling author of *The Boys in the Boat*, a gripping World War II saga of patriotism and resistance, focusing on four Japanese American men and their families, and the contributions and sacrifices that they made for the sake of the nation.

In the days and months after Pearl Harbor, the lives of Japanese Americans across the continent and Hawaii were changed forever. In this unforgettable chronicle of war-time America and the battlefields of Europe, Daniel James Brown portrays the journey of Rudy Tokiwa, Fred Shiosaki, and Kats Miho, who volunteered for the 442nd Regimental Combat Team and were deployed to France, Germany, and Italy, where they were asked to do the near impossible.

Brown also tells the story of these soldiers' parents, immigrants who were forced to submit to life in concentration camps on U.S. soil. Woven throughout is the chronicle of Gordon Hirabayashi, one of a cadre of patriotic resisters who stood up against their government in defense of their own rights.

Whether fighting on battlefields or in courtrooms, these were Americans under unprecedented strain, doing what Americans do best—striving, resisting, pushing back, rising up, standing on principle, laying down their lives, and enduring.

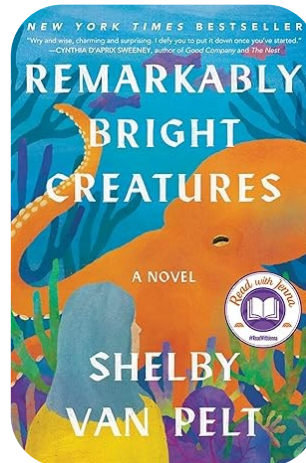

Keeping busy has always helped her cope, which she's been doing since her eighteen-year-old son, Erik, mysteriously vanished on a boat in Puget Sound over thirty years ago.

Tova becomes acquainted with curmudgeonly Marcellus, a giant Pacific octopus living at the aquarium. Marcellus knows more than anyone can imagine but wouldn't dream of lifting one of his eight arms for his human captors—until he forms a remarkable friendship with Tova. Ever the detective, Marcellus deduces what happened the night Tova's son disappeared. And now Marcellus must use every trick his old invertebrate body can muster to unearth the truth for her before it's too late.

Shelby Van Pelt's debut novel is a gentle reminder that sometimes taking a hard look at the past can help uncover a future that once felt impossible.

SUMMARY:

HOPE ended the year with Regular Envelope Giving of \$319,461 versus our estimate of \$312,516. This is a 4% increase when compared to our 2024 Regular Envelope Giving total. Total Income for 2025 of \$397,271 is very similar to a year ago, which was \$394,321.

As you may recall, we anticipated a possible loss in 2025. The church benefited from a few one-time income receipts but we also had several one-time expenses this year. The net effect was our Income did exceed our Expenses in the Regular Fund this year by \$5,373. This is a wonderful thing and thank you to all that made this possible. The Regular Fund account balance (the funds used in the day-to-day operations of the church) ended the year with a balance of \$280,956.

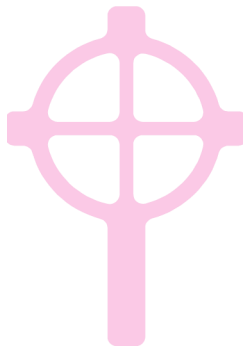

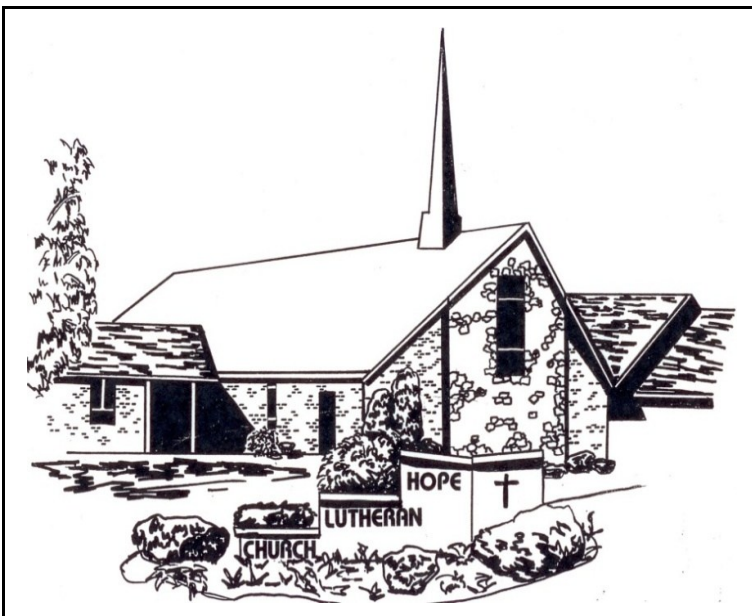
